### Part 1 Preliminary

#### 1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as Moreton Bay Regional Council Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2011.

#### 2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement *Moreton Bay Regional Council Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2011* in order to—
  - (a) protect the health and safety of persons using local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads; and
  - (b) preserve features of the natural and built environment and other aspects of the amenity of local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for—
  - (a) the regulation of access to local government controlled areas; and
  - (b) the prohibition or restriction of particular activities in local government controlled areas or roads; and
  - (c) miscellaneous matters affecting roads.

#### 3 Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by Moreton Bay Regional Council Local Law No.4 (Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2011 (the authorising local law).

#### 4 Definitions

Particular words used in this subordinate local law have the same meaning as provided for in the authorising local law.

# Part 2 Use of local government controlled areas, facilities and roads

#### 5 Prohibited and restricted activities—Authorising local law, s 5(1)

(1) For section 5(1)(a) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 1 are declared to be prohibited in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 1.

(2) For section 5(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 2 are declared to be restricted in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 2, to the extent described in column 3 of schedule 2.

## 6 Permanent closure of local government controlled area—Authorising local law, s 7(3)

For section 7(3) of the authorising local law the local government controlled areas described in schedule 3 are permanently closed to public access.

### Part 3 Matters affecting roads

## 7 Notice requiring owner of land adjoining road to fence land—Authorising local law, s 8(3)

- (1) For section 8(3) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for a fence that is required to prevent the escape of animals from the land and is subject to a compliance notice under section 8(2) of the authorising local law are as follows—
  - (a) must be constructed of materials which are of sufficient strength to prevent the animal(s) from escaping over, under or through the fence; and
  - (b) where the animal(s) have the ability to dig, includes a barrier installed directly below the fence to prevent the animal digging its way out; and
  - (c) where the animal(s) have the ability to climb or jump, the fence must be designed and constructed to a height which is sufficient to prevent the animal(s) climbing or jumping over the fence; and
  - (d) where the fence includes gates or panels which can be readily opened, those gates and panels must be kept closed and latched except when in immediate use by a person entering or leaving the premises on which the animal is kept.


